MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, AUGUST 21, 2017

At 7:02 P.M. on Monday, August 21, 2017 Chairwoman McMullen called the meeting of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority to order and makes the following announcement:

I hereby announce that pursuant to Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, that adequate notice of this meeting has been sent to the Asbury Park Press and is on the BRSA Official Website. Notice has also been sent to the Clerks of Aberdeen, Hazlet, Holmdel, Keansburg, Keyport, Matawan, Union Beach and Marlboro and the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority. This notice is also posted in the lobby of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority Administration Building.

Chairwoman McMullen asked all in attendance to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence for the safety of US Troops all over the world.

Chairwoman McMullen requested a roll call of attendance

REPORTS

Executive Directors Report, BRSA Projects, Special Reports & Connection Applications Mr. Fischer Reported:

Disaster Recovery:

• Contract 74S – Niro Incinerator – punch list and Scrubber Set Points are all that remain. A lot of punch list work has been completed in July.

- Had meeting with CPPE, Stone Hill Contracting, Hazen & IFCO. The Contractors sub (IFCO) and the Carbon Scrubber manufacturer (CPPE) have established carbon monoxide and temperature set points above which the quench will turn on to protect the unit.
- Contract 73S Pump Station Project a lot of punch list work has been completed and Plant #1 is back on line.
- Contract 80S Combined Blower Building; entire plant running on BB #1 to enable contractor to demolish BB #2 by pulling all the equipment out and re-piping to convert to the Combined Blower Building.
- Stone Hill submitted payment request #24 in the amount of \$124,038. Remsco submitted payment #21 in the amount of \$66,838.94.
- Combined cumulative phase I project payments excluding August payment totals \$24.2 million of that 88% is construction costs, 11% is engineering costs and 1% is administrative cost and NJEIT Technical fees. FEMA reimbursable portion is 62.4% or \$15.1M. Removing the upgrade portion brings the FEMA reimbursable to 80.1%. Removing the Sandy resiliency work brings the FEMA reimbursable at 90%.
- NJEIT Phase I note is \$28,113.307, requisitioned 86% of the loan to date.
- Phase II, Stone Hill Construction payment application #11 for the Combined Blower Building Project is in the amount of \$85,260.00
- At close of projects approximately \$26 M of the \$28 M loan will have been borrowed.
- The Authority portion will likely be around \$12 million.
- Loan in the amount of \$15 million for the Combined Blower Building and the Power Distribution Projects.
- Contract 80S Stone Hill Combined Blower Building submitted pay application #11 in the amount of \$85,260.
- PKF Mark III did not submit an invoice for August. When they came to inspect the grounds they found underground utility lines and pipes which delayed them in ordering the steel for the structure. Their mobilization has been set for October.

Executive Directors SAILS Certificate

Phase I short term loan matures on September 1, 2017. The intent was to convert that loan to a long term loan but because we still have contract payments to be made and FEMA money to be reimbursed to us we can't convert it yet. NJEIT said they would take the short term loan and add it to our Phase II loan which matures in June 2019. This way we only have one long term loan and only one closing, but after talking to the Auditor, General Counsel & Bond Counsel and with interest rates being low it doesn't make sense to wait until 2019 and probable pay a higher interest rate. Mr. Fischer asked Bond Counsel to ask NJEIT what could be done with the September 1, 2017 maturity. NJEIT said we could extend the maturity date to June 30, 2018 with no interest from Sept. 1st to June 30th, 2018. Currently we are paying .08 interest on the short term loan. The accrued interest to August 29, 2017 on the phase I loan would need to be paid as a condition, approximately \$29,000. If all agree the Executive Directors SAIL Certificate also must be executed. Chairwoman McMullen asked for a voice vote and all agreed.

2018 BRSA BUDGET

Mr. Fischer reported that the Supervisors met to discuss the Capital Budget items for 2018. There will be a budget meeting on August 29 and the staff will have their preliminary budget figures on September 8th. On October 9th the budget will be ready to present it to the Finance Committee – Commissioner Steiner, Whalen and McMullen. We will then introduce the budget at the October 16th

meeting for approval and send it down to the DCA for their approval. Final approval will take place at the Public Hearing at the December 18th meeting.

DORR OLIVER

Mr. Fischer spoke to the Board about the Dorr Oliver incinerator and our need to determine our options for this incinerator. He recommended that we get a proposal from Hazen and CBE Engineers to conduct a short feasibility analysis.

Staff Engineer Report

Mr. Peter Canal Reported:

- Metra Industries Contract 95-Change Order #1 in the amount not to exceed \$22,542.30 for time and materials for the mandrel test work.
- Matawan Force Main to increase the not to exceed amount from \$595,505.56 to \$818,164 for Cruz Construction and increase the R3M not to exceed amount from \$77,800 to 113,700.

Mike Samuel of R3M Engineering discussed the additional time and coordination due to unexpected interferences' and problems by the contractor. At this point we are anticipation the trench paving to be done in late September and address the swale on Clark Street.

Pete also explained that the adjustment was due to the fact that Hazlet put a force main right over our line and it had to removed, bypassed and reinstall a new pipe. Also on the Straub property we had to repair a lateral and fix the entrance pavement of the driveway.

- BR Welding, Inc. Change Order Primary Clarifiers 1 & 2 credit amount of \$12,040.21 and will probably be closed out next month.
- Sludge Concentration Tanks Rehab & Improvements RFP's were sent out August 10th for design engineer work to CH2MHill, CDM, Hazen & Sawyer and PS&S. Pre-bid meeting is on August 22nd and proposals are due on September 8th.
- Night Time Security Contract 99-current contract expires on October 14th seeking approval to advertise bids for a two year contract for Security Services.
- Regency @ Holmdel Crawfords Corner and Roberts Roads, Holmdel approve a bond reduction to a revised bond amount of \$387,028.
- Reserve @ Holmdel Crawfords Corner and Roberts Roads, Holmdel approve to release the bond contingent upon all attorney's fees paid in full.
- Stone Hill Construction Contract 74S approve Change Order #7 in the amount of \$275,031 John Wojnas of Hazen and Sawyer presented the modifications, additions and upgrades to the NIRO Incinerator. He explained that \$101,000 would be FEMA reimbursable.

Consulting Engineer – R3M Manuel Ponte Reported:

- Various Plant Building- NJEIT is reviewing Change Order 1 & 2. R3M responded to questions from FEMA and NJEIT regarding the Change Orders.
- Headworks Odor Control materials began to arrive at the sight and last week the scrubber was dismantled and examine the inside which was reported to be in good shape. Approximately 10 ft. of packing was replaced along with PVC header and nozzles. Two of the three grit chambers have been refurbished and the new fans should be installed in September. Also new fiberglass covers will replace the old covers.
- Work on the Matawan Force Main and the Raritan Valley Force Main is complete
- The 3rd Ouarter 2016/2017 Flow Report was presented to the Commissioners. All flows are

tracking as expected.

Superintendent's Report Mike Broyles Reported:

- Flow for July is pretty low.
- The effluent concentrations lately are not the concentrations you are used to seeing, After 23 days of suspended solids in single digits there was some kind of biological upset. Different techniques and adjustments finally got the tanks back to normal operation.
- Effluent Suspended Solid Violation is indicated for the month however.
- Incineration is going very well.
- July 18th we conducted a thermal Image of the incinerator shell
- Removed 1557 tons of ash, all three basins are empty.
- One reported odor complaint in July by Mr. Lauro, 9th Street, Union Beach

Commissioner Pisano asked Mike what action the NJDEP will take because of the Violation. Mike said it's probably a monitory penalty which they base on the severity of the violation and conduct of the Authority. The penalty could be somewhere between \$3,000 & \$7,000.

Mr. Fischer stated that the last violation the BRSA received was 57 months ago. Mike responded that besides the month after Superstorm Sandy the last violation was in February 2011. Mike said our conduct would be taken into consideration, i.e. our history of good compliance.

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (Authority) owns and operates four (4) sludge concentration tanks (concentration tanks) as part of its sludge dewatering and disposal system; and

WHEREAS, three (3) of the concentration tanks were installed in 1973 and the fourth tank was installed in 1986; and

WHEREAS, the concentration tanks are a critical unit process in the sludge dewatering and disposal system; and

WHEREAS, the concentration tanks operate in a very corrosive environment and as such are in need of rehabilitation and upgrade work after 40+ years of service; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer has developed a Request for Proposal for Engineering Design and Bidding Services for the Sludge Concentration Tank Rehabilitation and Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to seek proposals from four (4) Engineering firms previously identified as short listed engineering firms for the Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the engineering firms of CH2M, CDM Smith, PS&S and Hazen are all firms on the engineering short list.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority authorize the Chief Engineer to request proposals from the listed engineering firms for the

Engineering Design and Bidding Services for the Sludge Concentration Tank Rehabilitation and Improvement Project.

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority owns and operates two fluidized bed incinerators for the destruction of solids generated at the Authority treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Sewage Sludge Incineration Regulations (SSI Regs) at 40 CFR Part 62 the Authority is required to upgrade its incineration systems to meet the new emissions limits or shut the incinerator down; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has upgraded the NIRO incinerator to meet the new SSI Regs and on simultaneously on March 21, 2017 shut down the Dorr Oliver Incinerator; and

WHEREAS, since 1996 the Authority has operated the NIRO incinerator and used the Dorr Oliver incinerator as an emergency back up when the NIRO was down for servicing or repair; and

WHEREAS, the Dorr Oliver Incinerator must be upgraded to meet the new SSI Regulations if the Authority desires to have incineration as its primary and secondary means of solids removal; and

WHEREAS, the Dorr Oliver Incinerator upgrade must be analyzed to determine if the Dorr Oliver can be upgraded as an existing incinerator; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has received a proposal from Hazen and Chavond Barry working jointly to perform this analysis at a cost of \$28,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority Chief Engineer and Executive Director have reviewed the proposal and found it reasonable for the scope of work covered; and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this purpose in the Unrestricted Net Position of the Authority.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage

Authority award the contract for the Dorr Oliver Analysis to Hazen and Sawyer Engineering and Chavond

Barry Engineering in accordance with their proposal dated August 17, 2017.

<u>RESOLUTION NO. (90/17)</u>: To Secure Flood Insurance For the Authority Buildings Eligible For National Flood Insurance Program Coverage

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority ("Authority") owns several buildings at the Treatment Plant located at 100 Oak Street in Union Beach, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the buildings further identified as the Main Pump Station Addition, Blower Building 2, Chlorine Contact Building, Odor Control Building and Administration Building, are eligible for flood insurance under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP); and

WHEREAS, the Selective Insurance Company will provide total coverage of \$2,500,000 for building and \$417,400 for contents for a total premium of \$14,880 with a \$195,000 deductible; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of FEMA funding the Authority is required to obtain and maintain flood

insurance on all eligible buildings; and

WHEREAS, the quoted premiums and coverages have been reviewed by the Authority Risk Management consultants, Conner Strong & Buckelew who has recommended binding these coverages; and

WHEREAS, two additional buildings will require renewal next month, one building is being converted and allowed to flood and the remainder of the Authority buildings contain more than 50% of the building value below ground elevation and are therefore ineligible for flood insurance protection under the NFIP; and

WHEREAS funds are available for this purpose in the Authority insurance line item.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Reginal Sewerage Authority herby authorize the payment of the above stated premiums to secure flood insurance for the named Authority Buildings for a one year term according to the building renewal date and direct the Executive Director to execute all necessary documentation to secure this coverage.

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (Authority) owns and operates interceptor sewers in Keyport, Hazlet and Union Beach that are in need of rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contract Laws, Contract 95, Interceptor Sewer Rehabilitation Project, Phase 1 was awarded to Metra Industries, Inc. (MII) on December 19, 2016 for a total price of \$2,147,000 pursuant to Resolution 136/16; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the Contract and perform additional mandrel testing work

necessary for the completion of the project; and

WHEREAS, MII has submitted a proposal for Change Order No.1 to amend the contract work, in the amount of \$22,542.30; and

WHEREAS, the Authority staff and our consulting engineer, Gannet Fleming have reviewed the proposal and are recommending Change Order No.1, in the amount of \$22,542.30; and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this change order in the unrestricted position of the Authority NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority hereby approve Change Order No.1 for Metra Industries, Inc., in the amount of \$22,542.30 increasing the total Contract value to \$2,169,542.30.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Executive Director is hereby authorized to execute any necessary documents to approve this Change Order.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contract Laws, Contract 74-S NIRO Incinerator Repairs and Mitigation was awarded to Stone Hill Contracting Company, Inc. (SHC) on February 23, 2015 for a total price of \$16,445,997 via Resolution 35/15; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (Authority) previously approved Resolutions No.115/15 for Change Order No.1 in the amount of \$75,066, No.116/15 for Change Order No.2 in the amount of \$171,600, No.39/16 for Change Order No.3 in the amount of 104,495 and No.70/16 for Change Order No.4 in the amount of \$388,482.71, No. 123/16 for Change Order No.5 in the amount of \$350,661 and No. 6/17 for Change Order No.6 in the amount of \$242,391.60 increasing the total contract value to \$17,778,693.31; and
