Commissioner Cohen opened the meeting to the public for any comments or questions regarding the following resolutions. No public participants spoke at this time. Commissioner Cohen closed this public portion of the meeting and called for **MOTIONS** on the following Resolutions:

1. **REOLUTION (110/12):** To authorize the Executive Director to apply for public assistance from FEMA.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy caused extensive damage to the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority; and

HEREAS, the Authority is in need of assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA),

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority authorizes the Executive Director to submit a request for public assistance to the Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority authorize the Executive Director to take the necessary action to secure assistance from FEMA including attending application and kick-off meetings and filing of necessary forms, documents, and requests for information on behalf of the Authority.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy caused extensive damage to the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will seek public assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has a need for assistance in the form of on-going advice as it relates to response, recovery & mitigation and the FEMA process of public assistance for these phases of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority disaster; and

WHEREAS, CDM Smith has expertise and personnel in David K. Brauner, CFM, Former Senior Policy Specialist for the Department of Homeland Security and C. Shawn McLair, CPSM and will provide assistance and guidance as the need arises; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will establish a budget of \$20,000.00 for these services, not to be exceeded without written consent of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has received the rates for CDM staff being assigned to the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services being performed as a professional service,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority that it engages the services of CDM Smith, 1 Raritan Plaza, Edison, NJ 08837 to provide FEMA assistance as requested at the rates provided with a not to exceed budget of \$20,000.00.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy caused extensive damage to the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has resolved to contract for sludge thickening services under Resolution 108/12; and

WHEREAS, the Authority requires a company to transport and dispose of thickened sludge produced by the sludge thickening process; and

WHEREAS, Spectraserv Inc. of South Kearny, NJ has expertise in hauling and disposal of thickened sludge and has provided the Authority with a price of \$73.00 per cubic yard; and

WHEREAS, the Authority made an attempt to find the lowest cost and received two (2) competing quotes for this service, both of which were higher in price; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority that it engages the services of Spectraserv Inc., 75 Jacobus Avenue, South Kearny, NJ 07032 on an emergency basis to provide sludge hauling and disposal services to their facility in Kearny, NJ.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary shall cause a brief notice of the adoption of this Resolution to be published once in the Authority's designated official newspaper as required by law within ten (10) days of its adoption and will be posted on the BRSA official website.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy flooding rendered the treatment plant inoperable; and

WHEREAS, the Authority requires the services of our Consulting Engineer to aid in the response to disaster related damages, assessment of damage, guidance and design of restorative efforts, coordination of emergency contractors & suppliers and any other related needs as directed by the Authority Executive Director.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority that it engages the services of R3M Engineering Inc., 1405 Route 18, Suite 208, Old Bridge, NJ 08857 at their current rates on file for 2012 to assist the Authority with the aforementioned response to Hurricane Sandy.

WHEREAS, Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority provides its employees with dental benefits through Delta Dental; and

WHEREAS, Delta Dental of New Jersey is offering 12 month premium rates for dental coverage at \$48.15 per month for one (1) party coverage, \$93.14 per month for two (2) party coverage, and \$157.93 per month for three (3) party coverage; and

WHEREAS, said rates are 0.8% lower than current rates being paid for the same coverage with Delta Dental of New Jersey,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority accepts the 12 month rates offered by Delta Dental of New Jersey and contract with the same for the period December 1, 2012 to November 30, 2013.

WHEREAS, the flooding caused by Hurricane Sandy damaged or destroyed employee vehicles who were required to work during the hurricane; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority desire to assist the employees recover damages not covered by the employee auto insurance policy; and

WHEREAS, three (3) employee vehicles were deemed to be totaled by the flooding at the Authority; and,

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority that the Authority shall pay the blue book value for the employee vehicle not covered by comprehensive insurance at a cost of \$11,536.00 and will pay the \$100.00 deductible and \$500.00 deductible for the other two (2) vehicles that did have coverage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED said reimbursements are contingent upon proof of said damage by certified mechanics or the employee insurance carrier and proof of policy coverage and deductible values.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy caused extensive damage to the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, commercial power provided by JCP&L was interrupted for a period of approximately one (1) week due to flooding damage in Monmouth County; and

WHEREAS, the Authority generators provided power to the treatment plant while commercial power was interrupted requiring a frequent supply of diesel fuel delivery to the emergency generator storage tanks as well as temporary diesel driven pumps; and

WHEREAS, Duffy Fuel Oil Inc., the current BRSA contractor, was unable to supply the Authority with all of its fuel needs during this period; and

WHEREAS, Arrochar Fuel Corp. of Brooklyn, NY agreed to supply the Authority with fuel on an emergency basis; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority authorizes the purchase of diesel fuel as an emergency contract with Arrochar Fuel Corp., 7316 13th Avenue, Brooklyn, NY.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary shall cause a brief notice of the adoption of this Resolution to be published once in the Authority's designated official newspaper as required by law within ten (10) days of its adoption and will be posted on the BRSA official website.

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority requires file restoration services as an emergency contract; and

WHEREAS, Rapid Refile, LLC provides these services and has provided the Authority with its cost for restoration of \$182.76 per cubic foot for freezing, drying, cleaning and odor neutralization of documents and \$1,200.00 total for disinfection; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority will require these services on a file volume between 60 and 90 cubic feet; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority that it engages the services of Rapid Refile LLC, 7737 William Avenue, Suite #100, Allentown, PA 18106 on an emergency basis to provide file restoration services.

WHEREAS, Municipal Maintenance, Inc. provides such services and has provided Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority with its rate of \$115.00 per hour for an electrician and \$90.00 per hour for a mechanic and electrical helper; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority Municipal Maintenance Inc., 1352 Taylors Lane, Cinnaminson, NJ 08077 is hereby awarded a contract on an emergency basis to provide mechanical-electrical repair services.

WHEREAS, Longo Mechanical-Electrical, Inc. provides such services and has provided the Authority with its rates of \$115.00 per hour for an electrician, \$130.00 per hour for a mechanical technician and \$150.00 per hour for a senior switch gear technician; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,

WHEREAS, the project was completed under budget at a total contract cost of \$77,128.33 and Final Quantities Change Order in the credit amount of \$5,621.67 has been prepared; and

WHEREAS, the necessary close-out documents have been received and reviewed by Arcadis, BRSA Consulting Engineers; including the requisite two-year Maintenance Bond and Contractor's Release, and have been found to be in order by the Staff Engineer and Consulting Engineer; and

WHEREAS, the Authority can rent a thickened sludge pump at a cost of \$2,000.00 per month from Schwing Bioset while the Authority awaits the procurement of a new pump; and

WHEREAS, mobilization and demobilization costs of \$21,500.00 will be added to the first months rental charge only; and

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority has funding available to procure these disaster related services,
